NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

For the next several weeks we will share information about some of the men listed on our Honour Rolls.

The Newell family has the sad distinction of having three of its members so remembered. They were the sons of Isaac and Katherine Newell and some of the family are still members of our congregation.

Stoker 2nd Class *William Thomas Newell*, Service Number P/KX 98871, was a member of the Navy serving on H.M.S. Penzance. He died on August 24, 1940, when the ship was torpedoed by German U boat-37 SW of Iceland and sunk, with 90 of 108 crew lost. He is remembered at the Portsmouth Naval Memorial, Hampshire, United Kingdom.

Gunner *Charles Taylor Newell*, Service Number 970186, was a member of the Royal Artillery, 57th (Newfoundland) Heavy Regiment. He died March 17, 1941, age 23, and was buried at Norwich Cemetery, Norfolk, United Kingdom.

Douglas Leonard Newell, Royal Canadian Regiment, served in the Korean conflict and died on 3 May 1953. He was survived by a wife and young child.
