

On the day of his resurrection, Jesus appeared to two of his disciples on the road to Emmaus, but they did not recognize him. Later while he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him.

At this table, the Risen Jesus meets us in the breaking of bread, So come let us share in his feast of new and everlasting life!

## The Great Thanksgiving

Alleluia! thanks and praise to you, Almighty and Ever-Living God, creator of heaven and earth.

You formed us in your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast and constant.

And so, with your people of every time and every place, we join our voices in the unending hymn of light, life, and love, singing:

# Sung Response

Holy God of Power and Might! Hallelujah! Heav'n and earth shine with your light! Hallelujah! Loud Hosannas now we sing! Hallelujah! Blessings to our Risen King! Hallelujah!

God of our salvation, through your Son, Jesus Christ, and by the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection, you gave birth to your Church, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. Once we were no people, but now we are your people, and so we shout: **Alleluia!** 

By your great mercy we have been born anew to a living hope through Christ's resurrection. You have given us the promise of new hope, new possibilities, and new life, through your unfathomable, unending, and unconditional love and grace.

On the night before he died, Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to those who sat with him, saying: "Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Each time you do this, remember me."

In the same way he took the cup, saying: "Take, drink. This is my blood, poured out for you, for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, remember me."

On the day you raised him from the dead, Jesus was recognized by his disciples in the breaking of the bread, and even today he comes to meet us as we share this meal together. And so, with joy we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

Send, O God, your Holy Spirit, upon us and upon these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ. Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, God most holy, now and forever.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Lord, we died with you on the cross.

Now we are raised to new life.

We were buried in your tomb.

Now we share in your resurrection.

Live in us, that we may live in you.

#### **NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES**

On Good Friday Apr 19, 1957, the Choir presented "A Good Friday Meditation on the Sacred Passion of the Holy Redeemer".

Extract from Choir report 1979: "On Good Friday Apr 13, the Choir, with the assistance of Lynn Channing, Michael Donnan, Morgan Sharpe and Carla Furlong, presented "Requiem" by Gabriel Fauré. The public support for this presentation was the best the Choir has experienced.
