

Congratulations to our Music Director! Tristan's vacation in January wasn't an ordinary trip to Ontario. He was on a 2-city tour with the Canadian Chamber Choir; of which he has been a proud member since 2008. The choirs mandate is to build community through choral singing, and share that art with the rest of the country. Choir members are from across the country. They gather two to three times a year, in a different province, performing Canadian composers music. The choir gave workshops to the University of Windsor and Western University, and performed new works by composer and artist Sheryl Sewepagaham. Sheryl shared how to engage with indigenous and First Nations communities through music education; and both Sheryl and the choir shared in concerts and workshops with choirs of all age ranges.
