

FDEE – SUMMER WORK: First Dawn Eastern Edge Regional Council Office in St. John's is hiring two youth this summer to work in our Office, Bookstore and Archives. We received a Canada Summer Jobs grant from Service Canada as well as funding from the Regional Council Archives. Two positions are available of 8-week duration (Mon-Fri, 8:30am–4pm) starting as early as June 26; ending as late as August 25, 2023. As per the Canada Summer Jobs agreement, the youth must:

- be between 15 and 30 years of age (inclusive) at the start of employment;
- be a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee* Protection Act; and
- be legally entitled to work according to the relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations.

^{*} International students are not eligible. Recent immigrants are eligible if they are Canadian Citizens or permanent residents. We are accepting resumes from youth who are interested in one of these positions. **The deadline for receiving resumes is Friday, June 9, 2023**. Resumes may be forward
