

LENTEN SYMBOLS Lenten Symbols - Chain

The image of Jesus bound and fettered is a most unpleasant one, and yet we must recognise that each of us continues to bind Jesus when we keep our brothers and sisters in bondage. We bind our fellow pilgrims when we keep them dependant on us and enslaved by us. Around us are persons who do not know about fair equal pay, safe working conditions, and a realistic standard of living. They are chained to a way of life that includes fear, repression and dependency.

We also see around us persons who seem bound to traditions, fearful of change and unwilling to experience new life.

We place on the cross a chain, symbolic of the bondage we create and a reminder of the Good News that we are bound by Jesus' love.

(A candle is extinguished and the chain hung from the cross)

PRAYER: God of the wilderness, be with us as we wander through the desert of our lives. Keep us from running back to the safety of old assumptions, and walk with us as we learn to live the life abundant. Amen.
