

The Choir, reporting a membership of 26, was present at all worship services with special music presented at Easter and Christmas. The annual Afternoon Tea and Musicale held near St. Patrick's Day was its usual success. During 100th anniversary celebration services of the congregation former choir members were welcomed back to perform with the Choir. The Junior Choir was reorganized and led the music during the Christmas Eve Family Service and performed with the Senior Choir during the service of lessons and carols.
