Next year, 2022, is the 140th anniversary of our congregation worshiping on Cochrane Street. I thought it might be interesting to look back 40 years. All "Notes" from November 14 to December 19 are taken from the 1982 Annual Report.

Christmas services were held with special music by the Choir and Mr C K Adams, our new organist and choir director. (Dr D K Peters resigned these positions in May 1982 after serving the congregation for 31 years.) On Dec 24th, the Family Christmas Eve Service and White Gift Service was held with a pageant, scripture readings and hymns. The Junior Choir was in attendance. The Dec 31st Watchnight Service was held in the church, and all were invited to the church hall after the service for a night of fun sponsored by the adult group, Pairs and Spares.
