

NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

Did you know that in 1971 a proposal was made to construct stairs to the "choir room" on the third floor from the stairwell in the office area? These stairs were indeed built. Before this renovation, the only access to that room was along the corridor on the third floor. This room was formerly called the Bible Class Room.
