

Additional blessed chalk is available at the back of the sanctuary if you wish to use them to bless your own doorways.

NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

Laying of the Cornerstone of our first church - September 7, 1880 (Part 1)

The Rev. J. Shenton held up a glass jar, and said, -"This jar contains a parchment with the names written on it of the person laying this cornerstone, and the time of the ceremony, the Queen, His Excellency the Governor, the Ministers of the St. John's Circuit, the Trustees, the Building Committee, the Architect, and the Builder, the Minutes of the Newfoundland Conference for 1880, a copy of the Gospel of St. John. The religious newspapers of the Denomination: the *Wesleyan*, of Halifax, *Guardian*, of Toronto, and *Watchman*, of London. The local papers and those of Newfoundland: *The Royal Gazette, Ledger, Telegram, Chronicle, Times, Advocate, Newfoundlander, North Star, Temperance Journal, Harbour Grace Standard, Carbonear Herald*, and *Twillingate Sun*, a Newfoundland Almanac, and the coins of Newfoundland.
