

## NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

One of the building's architects, Robert H Macdonald of Montreal, visited the church building site twice during construction –once in June 1915 and again in September of that year. In June he was accompanied by the Mr Dunn, contractor for the Downing, Cook Co, who had the contract for the construction of the building.

H R Dowswell, the chief designer of the architectural firm, Ross and Macdonald, visited in May 1915. He later moved to an architectural firm in New York City and worked on the design of the Empire State Building. That firm, Shreve, Lamb and Harmon, designed a military base in Newfoundland for the US Army. That base was Fort Pepperell.
