

Financial Update: The winter months are among the most challenging for our cash-flow. The cold and snowy weather sometimes makes it hard to get to church. Our main source of revenue are the financial contributions we receive from members. Just like a household, we have financial commit-ments that need to be met throughout the year to support our mission and ministry. **COCHRANE CENTRE – Update on Construction in the Sanctuary:** In 2018, Cochrane Centre was awarded \$100,000 from the City of St. John's to make capital improvements in the sanctuary. First Light began working with local contractor K & P Contracting to complete the work associated with the leaking roof in January. The two corners at the front of the sanctuary have had work completed, and are now ready for cosmetic work.

The unfortunate battle with water, is that it will continue to find a way in as long as the entire building is not water tight. We have noticed that water continues to find its way in near those corners, but now in different locations. We are working with K & P to stretch the dollars as far as we can before beginning any cosmetic work. We will be meeting with them again next week to determine the priority areas.

Ice on the roof at the Cochrane Centre entrance has caused new leaks as well. This puts at risk the work carried out in the vestibule last year, so we have made this area a priority. We will provide updates in upcoming bulletins to keep the congregation up to date on progress. We look forward to restoring the sanctuary with you all!

# NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

Organization of the Woman's Association (WA) dates from Church Union in 1925. However, there were Ladies Aid Societies in many congregations before this time. The purpose of the organization was to deepen the spiritual life of the women of the Church and to promote a program of Christian fellowship and service, personal evangelism, and stewardship. This was defined as assistance to the local minister, visitation, and promotion of Christian education in the home and Sunday school, and general oversight of the furnishing of the manse. (Victoria University Archives, Administrative history of the WA).

Of interest to us at Cochrane Street might be the following records located in the Archives: Service bulletin for the bi-annual meeting of the WA St. John's Presbytery held at Cochrane Street 1957, and a short history of the WA of Cochrane Street written by Mrs. Alex Marshall and dated 1959.
