

COCHRANE CENTRE – Update on Construction in the Sanctuary: In 2018, Cochrane Centre was awarded \$100,000 from the City of St. John's to make capital improvements in the sanctuary. First Light began working with local contractor K & P Contracting to complete the work associated with the leaking roof in January. The two corners at the front of the sanctuary have had work completed, and are now ready for cosmetic work.

The unfortunate battle with water, is that it will continue to find a way in as long as the entire building is not water tight. We have noticed that water continues to find its way in near those corners, but now in different locations. We are working with K & P to stretch the dollars as far as we can before beginning any cosmetic work. We will be meeting with them again next week to determine the priority areas.

Ice on the roof at the Cochrane Centre entrance has caused new leaks as well. This puts at risk the work carried out in the vestibule last year, so we have made this area a priority. We will provide updates in upcoming bulletins to keep the congregation up to date on progress. We look forward to restoring the sanctuary with you all!

NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

The United Church Women (UCW) was formed in 1962 with the disbanding of both the Women's Association and the Women's Missionary Society. In Newfoundland, the inaugural meeting of the UCW at the Conference level was held at Cochrane Street on March 13, 1962, with Mrs. Blanche Luscombe of our congregation elected President. Our records date from 1962 and comprised of minutes, list of members, and reports from the various units into which the UCW was organized. Unit records other than the Fellowship Unit end at 1998 with the Fellowship unit records ending in 2010. Of interest from the Archives might be a pillow containing the embroidered names of 30 members and guests who attended a garden party at the home of one of the unit leaders, Olga Davis, on July 28, 1983.
