

NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

Thanksgiving Sunday

From the *Methodist Monthly Greeting* for Nov 1925: "Large congregations, impressive services and generous giving marked Thanksgiving Sunday at Cochrane Street Church. The presence of Dr. Chown, late General Superintendent of the Methodist Church, as the preacher for the day, formed an attraction. Miss Eleanor Mews sang *Righteous Art Thou, O Lord*, and also the solo *As Pants the Heart*. Both were given very beautifully. The choir rendered the anthems and service music with great expression and reverence, most of the music being unaccompanied – the greatest test of a choir. The eloquent sermons, the reverent worship, the inspiring hymns, in which the vast congregation heartily joined, made it a day of joy and gladness indeed, and one to be long remembered."
