

NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

November 3-7, 1930: "A Convention: Religious Education for all Sunday School Workers" was held in St. John's. On the Thursday evening the meeting for teenage youth was held at Cochrane Street. There were two addresses: "The teenage girl and the international convention" by Marjorie Thompson, and "The boy and the church" by Mr. A B Butt. The Newfoundland Girls in Training [later CGIT] group presented a pageant.
